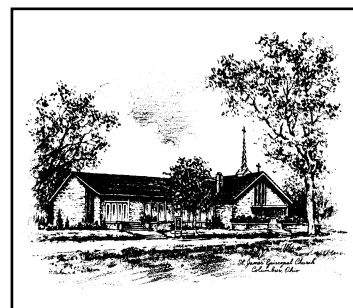


Around Saint James'...

ST. JAMES TO HOST OUR 7TH ANNUAL IFTAR ON THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 2ND, 2010

As before, St. James members will cook for and break Fast with our Muslim neighbors to welcome them and to honor their Holy Month of Ramadan. Worldwide Muslims fast by day for an entire lunar month to purify themselves and to recognize the experience of the hungry poor. Ramadan culminates with a great festival, but Muslims break their Fast daily at sundown, after prayer. St. James invites our guests to pray (in the Lamborne Room, and we may respectfully observe) and to a shared meal so that our guests need not cook while fasting.

This year, we at St. James will again grow our Iftar tradition, which has the blessing of our Bishop and Deanery. It's up to you—please reach out to your Muslim neighbors, co-workers, and friends. Tell them about our St. James Iftar, invite them to come, and arrange to meet them or bring them. Even if they do not come, they will be pleased to be asked, and it is another way we can spread our welcome. Please also plan to prepare a dish—a hearty lamb stew, chicken bake, and sides are always great. All cuisines work well. There will be easy instructions and suggestions on the sign-up sheet on the bulletin board near the Lamborne Room, and *the only critical things are "halal" meat (from an Eastern food mart: list provided), no pork, and no alcohol used in cooking or beverages.* And finally please consider fasting yourself for that day, whether you can join Iftar or not. It brings us closer in this inter-faith event.

to a wide range of information and resources – from both public and private entities – that can help them search for a job, find education and training opportunities, and learn about the many other services and supports that might be available to them.

“Whether they’re looking for job openings, help with managing finances or the location of their nearest food pantry, they can find it at Ohioheretohelp.com,” said Director Lumpkin. “The site has information on just about any topic that might be a concern for unemployed workers and their families. We designed it to be comprehensive, dynamic and user-friendly.”

Ohioheretohelp.com is divided into the following primary sections:

- “I Need Assistance With...” provides helpful links to information about money, food, health care, housing, transportation, child care, veterans’ services, education and training, and more.
- “Job Search” gives visitors access to more than 100,000 job openings in and near Ohio through a direct link to Ohio Means Jobs (www.ohiomeansjobs.com).
- “Free Download” allows visitors to download and print many of the applications and forms mentioned on the site. It also allows visitors to print a “Back on Track Checklist,” which is an easy way to make sure they’re getting all the assistance they need.
- “Stay Connected with Us!” allows visitors to register their names and e-mail addresses to receive notifications about upcoming events and other resources available in their area. Ohioheretohelp.com also links to employment and economic news, video tutorials and online skill building courses. It even features a special section for unemployed teenagers.

“This Web site will help Ohioans learn about, apply for and receive necessary assistance while they search for their next job,” said Director Lumpkin. “It complements the outstanding work already being done around the state at One-Stop Centers and county departments of job and family services.”
